# Oral Health Awareness and Education on the oral manifestation of HIV/AIDS in Durham, NC

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION and GOALS

The objective of the Schweitzer project was to collaborate with The SNDA CAARE's Clinic in order to raise local awareness on oral health with a strong emphasis on the relationship between HIV/AIDS and the oral cavity. The Fellow aimed to assist HIV+ patients and their families avoid and/or lessen the impact of problematic oral lesions commonly seen secondary to HIV diagnosis and/or treatment.

## **CLINIC SERVICES**

Dental services offered:

- Extractions
- Cleanings
- Limited Exams
- Restorative
- Digital X-rays

Each HIV+ patient seen at our clinic received a detailed PowerPoint lecture on common

#### RESULTS


- Two appointments per week were dedicated to servicing HIV+ patients at the CAARE Clinic with free dental care and oral health education.
- \$844 of free dental care was provided to 13 HIV+ patients.
- 42 dental students signed a pledge that they would actively help eliminate stigmas in the dental community regarding patient's living with HIV/AIDS
- 2 referrals were made to UNC Hospital Dental Clinic

#### SUSTAINABILITY

Dental student Tayla Cunningham, a 3rd year dental student at UNC and Vice President of

oral lesions seen as a result of HIV. Proper oral hygiene instructions were given to all patients at the clinic regardless of their health status.


