

Chatham County Hotspotting

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Background

Hotspotting: A strategy to focus efforts and direct resources to high utilizers of healthcare.

Target population: Frequent utilizers of the Chatham Hospital Emergency Department (ED). Providers identified patients who frequently present to the ED for non-emergent reasons and who have underlying socioeconomic issues.

Social determinants of health (SDOH):

Factors outside the Neighborhood medical arena that affect and Built **Environment** one's health, such as socioeconomic **Economic** Health and Stability **Health Care** Social status, access to **Determinants** of Health healthcare, literacy, education, and home Social and safety. According Education Community Context to the CDC, communities with poor SDOH have worse health outcomes than more prosperous communities.¹


Services Provided

- Initial Home Visits for SDOH assessments
- Follow up phone calls and home visits
- Referrals to community resources
- Communication with primary care provider
- Assistance completing phone calls
- Education on "when to use" the emergency department vs urgent care vs primary care
- Education on healthy habits

Outcomes

- ❖ 16 total individual clients and their families visited
- ❖ 14/16 clients connected to PCP or urgent care provider
- **♦ 11/16** clients received ≥2 referrals
- **45** total community referrals made
- \$9+ different types of SDOH addressed


Conclusions

Home visits improved the client experience:

Home visits improved the student experience:

- Increased empathy for patient experience
- Direct visualization of effects of SDOH
- Increased ability to address SDOH
